### **WORLD POLIO DAY: OCT. 24TH**

World Polio Day highlights the global efforts to end polio worldwide. These efforts had their origin as a Rotary initiative to immunize children in the Philippines which ultimately led to the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) in 1988 to eradicate polio worldwide.

When the GPEI began, polio paralyzed more than 1,000 children worldwide every day. Since then, nearly 3 billion children have been immunized. Only two countries remain who have not stopped polio transmission: Pakistan and Afghanistan, the current focus of the GPEI's efforts.

Every year on 24 October, we observe World Polio Day to raise awareness of the importance of polio vaccination and to celebrate the many parents, professionals and volunteers whose contributions make polio eradication achievable. To ensure a polio-free future for everyone, efforts must continue to maintain high immunization



coverage, implement high-quality surveillance to detect any presence of the virus, and prepare to respond in the event of an outbreak.

#### HOW YOUR CLUB CAN HELP

Whether you're hosting a fundraiser for World Polio Day, putting up a billboard to raise awareness, or giving a talk on polio at a local school, no action is too big or too small! If an event or project involves more than one club (district, zone, or country level), each club should register individually to reflect its participation.
