Before relocating to the United States in 2017, Moh held the position of Humanitarian Response Specialist for the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA) in the Gaza Strip, Palestine. His work involved coordinating and managing humanitarian efforts during crisis and rise of conflicts.

Prior to his current role at Rotary, Moh contributed his expertise as a Visiting Lecturer at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. During this time, he taught a diverse array of subjects, ranging from Middle East politics to conflict analysis, history, civil society, and non-governmental organizations.
